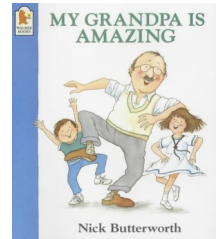
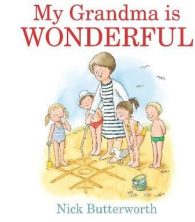
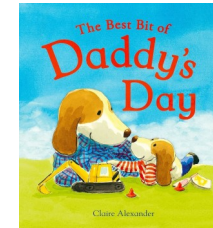
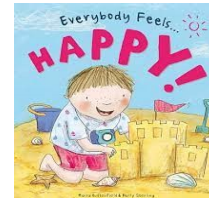
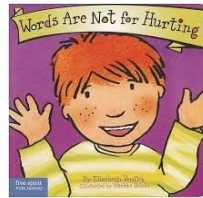
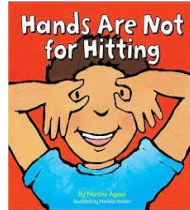
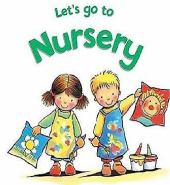
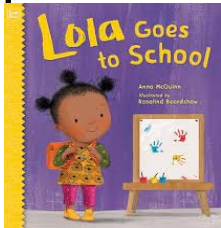


Nursery Curriculum Planner: Autumn 1: It's good to be me

Key books for this half term:



Lola Goes to School

This book is all about Lola and her first day at school.

Key vocabulary: Lola, family, school, pictures, read, play, snack, mummy.

Let's go to Nursery

This book is all about Annie and Joe having a busy time at nursery.

Key vocabulary: Annie, Joe, nursery, paint, pictures, play, sandpit, whizz, playground.

Hands Are Not for Hitting

This book is about all the correct ways we can use our hands. It reminds us that hands are not for hitting.

Key vocabulary: Hands, hitting, hurt, drawing, playing, building, eating, drinking.

Words Are Not for Hurting

This book is about all the correct words to use. It reminds us that words are not for hurting.

Key vocabulary: Words, hurt, hurting, soft, loud.

The Colour Monster

This book is all about the Colour Monster who learns about his feelings.

Key vocabulary: happy, sad, upset, calm, fear, scared, confused, love.

Everybody Feels Happy!

This book is about occasions that make us feel happy.

Key vocabulary: Happy, body-board, collected, exciting, fizzy, ideas, leaflet, lent.

The Best Bit of Daddy's Day

This book is about a boy called Bertie who wants to drive trucks and diggers like his daddy.

Key vocabulary: Daddy, builder, digger, crane, tower.

My Grandma is Wonderful

This book is about a wonderful grandma who is good at many things.

Key vocabulary: Grandma, ice-cream, nature, knots, clothes.

My Grandpa is Amazing!

This book is about an amazing grandpa who is extremely kind.

Key vocabulary: Grandpa, ice-cream, patience, wrong.

Learning experiences: Starting nursery

Getting to know our classroom and our nursery grounds and getting to know our friends.

Learning experiences: Rules and Routines

Learning rules and routines and learning to share and take turns.

Learning experiences: Feelings

We will be talking about our feelings. We will begin to show how we are feeling using words and actions.

We will be talking about our families and who is special to us, sharing our family photos and drawing pictures of our families.

Nursery Curriculum Planner: Autumn 1: It's all about me.

Physical Development:

Gross Motor Skills (big body movements)

We will be introducing the children to Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle lessons. Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle impacts on writing with instant results. We will learn nine separate dances that provide the missing link between mark making and letter formation.



Fine Motor Skills (small movements of the hands)

We will be introducing the children to Dough Disco. Dough Disco is a selection of fine muscle exercises that support child to develop the muscles in their fingers so that they are ready to write letters.



Literacy: We will have story time every day!

Reading:

- We will begin to join in and sing songs.
- We will enjoy sharing books with an adult.
- We will repeat words and phrases from familiar stories.

Writing:

- We will enjoy drawing and making marks freely.

Story Sacks: We will retell stories with help from puppets and story cards.

Poetry Basket: We will learn poems off by heart and perform them.



Expressive Arts and Design:

- We will take part in simple pretend play, using an object to represent something else.
- We will explore paint, using fingers as well as brushes and other tools.
- We will move and dance to music.
- We will begin to join in with songs and rhymes and take part in action songs, such as 'Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star'.

Communication and Language:

- We will develop attention skills by responding to daily routines.
- We will listen to and respond to a simple, 1 step instruction
- We will start to develop conversation, often jumping from topic to topic
- We will start to say how they are feeling, using words as well as actions.
- We will develop pretend play.

PSED:

We will be learning our EYFS rules which are:



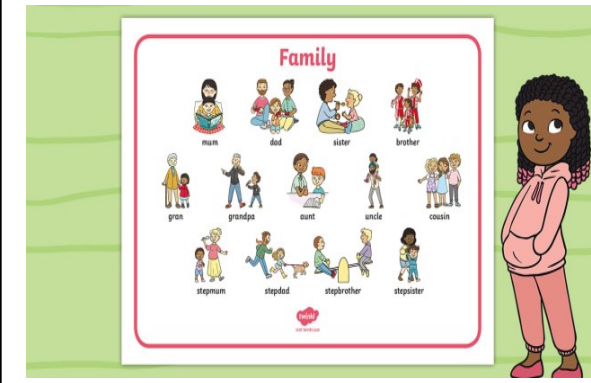
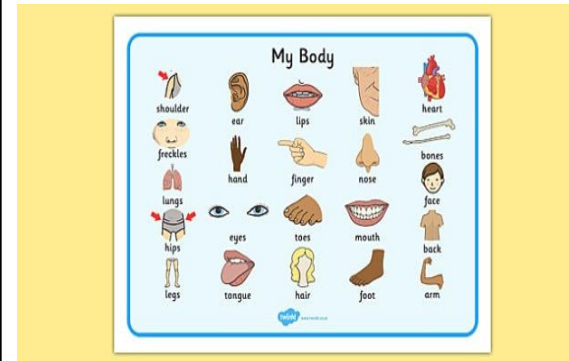
- We will start to manage the transition into nursery separating from our caregiver and building relationships with adults.
- We will start to manage transitions in the day.
- We will begin to develop friendships.
- We will begin to develop confidence in play on our own and with other children.
- We will start to develop independence in routines

Maths:

- We will begin to take part in finger rhymes with numbers.
- We will begin to use counting-like behaviour, such as making sounds, pointing or saying some numbers in sequence.
- We will count in everyday contexts, sometimes skipping numbers.
- We will build with a range of resources.
- We will match irregular shapes by completing inset puzzles.
- We will talk about and identify the patterns around us e.g. stripes on clothes, designs on rugs and paper, using informal language like spotty, blobs, pointy, stripy etc.
- We will sort objects to match – e.g colour sets, shapes, objects.
- We will begin to recognise up to 3 objects, without having to count them individually.

Understanding the World:

- We will use all of our senses in hands-on exploration.
- We will make connections between the features of our family and other families.
- We will begin to make sense of our own life-story and family's history.
- We will begin to develop positive attitudes between people.

Encouraging independence:

Teach your child to use the toilet independently.

Teach your child to wash their hands independently.

Teach your child how to get dressed independently, including pulling up their own pants and trousers.

Teach your child to put on their own coat and shoes.
