

# Year 3 Light

At Merridale, history, geography, art and design and technology are taught through a topic based approach which we call discover.


## <u>History</u>

Children will look at what light sources people used in the past and look at where they might sit on a timeline.



Key figures they will learn about include

Thomas Edison



## <u>Geography</u>

In geography, children will look at the human and physical features of India.

They will learn different landscapes and look at maps to spot mountains, deserts and rivers. They will also look at maps to identify places of interest such as the Golden Temple and Taj Mahal.

Children will also compare the UK and India.



### Art and Design

Children will study the work of the Dutch painter, Vincent Van Gogh, looking particularly at The Starry Night painting. They will identify features of his artwork and create their own versions in paint. They will learn how to make a darker and lighter shade, by either adding black or white. They will also create small lines



and dots of different shades to help create the desired effect.
