Reading

- Read words with Set 2 sounds
- Read simple sentences and answer what and where questions.
- Talk about characters and predict what might happen next.

Ideas for support at home:

- Hear your child read 5 times a week for 20 minutes.
- Read regularly to your child so they can hear what good reading sounds like.
- Discuss how the characters are feeling and how you know.
- Create what and where questions for your child to answer e.g. "What is he doing?" "Where are they going?"
- Visit a library and borrow some books. Share books together.

This gives you an overview of what your child will be learning in school this half term and ideas of how to support them. with their learning at home.

Science

Our topic this half term is Animals including Humans. During this topic, children will be taught to

- Name, locate and draw major parts of the human body.
- Name and locate their five senses.
- Explore how our five senses help us.

Ideas for support at home:

- Name parts of the body with your child and play Simon Say's with the tricker ones to locate and use proper names e.g. elbow, shoulder, earlobe, abdomen, spine.
- Explore senses through smelly pots. Place some spices in pots can children smell then and decide if they like them?
- Create some tastes tests with unusual tastes. Blindfold your child and get them to be brave and try them.
 Can they work out what they are trying? Can they say if it is sweet or sour.
- Go on a nature walk and encourage children to listen to what they can hear. Can they identify where the sound is coming from? Can they name the thing that creates the sound?

Maths

Place value

Read and write numbers to 20 in numerals and words Count objects to 20 reliably by arranging them first. Count forwards and backwards from any given number to 20.

Sequence numbers to 20 on a numberline.

Identify one more and one less than any given number to 20.

Use < and > to order numbers

Addition and Subtraction

Recognise the symbol for addition + and understand it is combining two parts to make the whole.

Explore addition within 10 and make fact families.

Know the concept of subtraction is taking away one part from a whole.

Explore subtraction within 10.

Ideas for support at home

- Count objects.
- Ask children to count on from a number and practise.
- Get 10 things and find different ways of splitting them into two parts.
- Practise writing numbers to 20 in words and numerals.
- Use doodle regularly.

During this half term children will learn explore working in groups to copy and observe others. They will explore and describe move-




- Play simple ball games at home involving rolling and passing to a partner.
