Key texts for this half term:



Writing

During the next half term children will write for a variety of purposes including: instructions, an information text and a narrative retelling.

- Write a series of simple sentences with a subject and verb.
- Write in third person and past tense to retell a story using a structure of beginning, middle and end.
- Use the word "and" to join to clauses together.
- Use simple adjectives for colour and size.
- Use imperative verbs and adverbs of time.

<u>Reading</u>

- Read words with the first 12 set 3 sounds
- Read simple sentences and answer what and where questions.
- Talk about characters and predict what might happen next.

Ideas for support at home:

- Hear your child read 5 times a week for 20 minutes.
- Read regularly to your child so they can hear what good reading sounds like.
- Discuss how the characters are feeling and how you know.
- Create what and where questions for your child to answer e.g. "What is he doing?" "Where are they going?"
- Visit a library and borrow some books.



Year | Spring 2

This gives you an overview of what your child will be learning in school this half term and ideas of how to support them. with their learning at home.

<u>Science</u>

We will be continuing our topic of Materials this half term. Children will learn:

- Distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made.
- Identify and name a variety of everyday materials including: wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock.
- Describe properties of materials. Ideas for support at home:
- Go on a materials hunt at home. Make a list of the objects that all into the material categories.
- Create a model from recycled materials.

Our second topic this half term is Season Changes. In this topic children will:

- identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees
- observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

Ideas for support at home:

- Go on a nature walk. Can you spot any signs of spring coming?
- Talk about the change in the daylight hours and why.

<u>Maths</u>

Place value

Read and write numbers from 0-50 in numerals and words Count in multiples of 10 to 50. Use < and > to order numbers to 50. Use knowledge of place value to order numbers to 50.

Measures—Length and Height.

Compare lengths and height using words—longer than, shorter than and taller than. Find lengths and heights using non-standard units (Cubes) Order lengths using 1st, 2nd, 3rd. Use a 30centimeter ruler to measure lengths Solve problems involving length.

Measures—Weight and Capacity

Compare weight using heavier and lighter than. Use balance scales to compare mass Describe capacity using full, half full and empty. Measure capacity using non-standard units including spoons, jugs, cups.

Ideas for support at home

- Practice counting on and back from any number within 50.
- Practice ordering numbers to 50.
 - Explore length and height at home comparing objects and ordering them in height from shortest to tallest. If you have a ruler look at how to measure. Can they use a ruler to draw lines of different lengths?
 - Explore weight and capacity at home. Can children take part in baking using scales or measuring liquid?
- Continue to practice learning and recalling number bonds to 10 and 20.
