

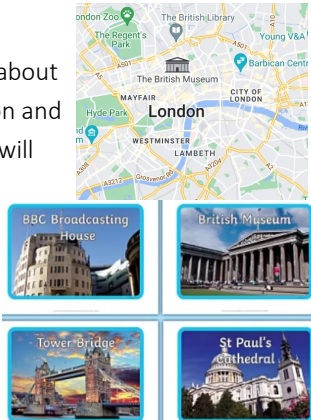


Year 1 Back in Time

At Merridale, history, geography, art and design and technology are taught through a topic based approach which we call discover.

Geography

In geography, children will learn about the capital city of England, London and it's importance to the U.K. They will learn about key physical and human characteristic of London as well as learn about and identify key buildings as part of their monarchy studies.



History

Children will be introduced to The Monarchy. First we will look at King Charles III working back from present life to early childhood. We will then study Queen Elizabeth II and her legacy as well as the royal family tree. We will then travel further back in time and learn about Queen Victoria and her reign.



Design Technology

Children will complete one DT project this half term around the theme of carriages linked to the monarchy. Children will first evaluate existing products looking at The Golden State Coach before designing their own. They will then be taught the following skills ready to apply them in their independent making project:

- Understand that wheels and axels can be assembled in two different ways.
- Explore how to use hand tools safely including: junior hacksaw, bench hook and scissors.

Children will then evaluate their products against the design criteria.
